I. Call to Order Open Session:

Chairman Bowers called the Open Session to order at 7:00 PM.

II. A. Public Input:

II. C.1. MSBA/SSBC Update:

- a. Hydroseeding, replacement of tress/shrubs, weeding of garden beds began on June 20th and continues.

II. D.1. Presentation: Dr. Laurie Witts, School District Physician

Dr. Laurie Witts, School District Physician, made her annual presentation to the School Committee on her work and the school nurses' work in the district. Dr. Witts highlighted the number of visits to the school nurses, and the top reasons for the visits.

II. D.2. North Reading High School Trip Proposal: Norway, Denmark, Sweden; April 2017

Mr. Evan Noce, the co-advisor of the International Travel Club and NRHS teacher proposed a student trip to include travel to Norway, Denmark, and Sweden during the April 2017 school vacation week.

The Committee voted on a motion by Mr. Webster and seconded by Ms. Koepke to approve the April 2017 student trip with the International Travel Club going to Norway, Denmark, and Sweden. Motion passed 5-0.

II. D.3. Presentation: Middle School Health Education Curriculum

Ms. Catherine O'Connell, NRMS Principal, and Ms. Claudia Brown, Health Education Specialist, presented a proposal to add a "Healthy Relationships" component to the Health Education curriculum for North Reading Middle School students.

- Update: Plan to Install Modesty/Individual Changing Stations in locker rooms at North Reading Middle/High School: At the May 23, 2016 meeting of the North Reading School Committee, members requested that the Superintendent explore the installation of modesty/individual changing stations in the locker rooms at North Reading Middle/High School. The Superintendent and the Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds have met and reviewed options to install modesty/individual changing stations in each of the Middle/High School locker rooms as follows: three stations in each of the two Middle School locker rooms and two stations in each of the High School locker rooms. Installations will be completed for the start of the 2016-2017 school year.
