	-Data will be collected through surveys and common assessments for the science		
	and technology department.		
	- <u>Idea for surveys:</u> Ask students if they identify with a specific group so the		
	department can see if any specific demographics feel left out or not included in		
	class.		
	- <u>Action 2:</u> The science and technology department will implement best practices of blended learning combining online educational materials and opportunities for interaction online with traditional place-based classroom methods.		
	- <u>Idea for technology</u> : Create research projects to integrate technology in the class.		
	- <u>Action 1:</u> Special Education Teachers will focus on the Use/Over Use of non-standard accommodations.

	3. Speech to text		
	4. Read aloud(entire test)
