II. C.2. Fiscal Year 2020 North Reading Public Schools' Capital Improvement Plan Presentation

The final proposal of the Fiscal Year 2020 NRPS's Capital Improvement Plan was reviewed and accepted by the School Committee.

III. D.1. Proposal: North Reading High School Trip; Harvard Model United Nations Conference 2019

Mr. Sotirios Pintzopoulos (NRHS teacher and Advisor of the Model United Nations Club), as well as the President, Mr. Michael Tyrrell and Treasurer, Ms. Madeleine Rutherford, proposed for approval of the Committee the Model United Nations Club attendance at the 2019 Harvard Model United Nations Conference on January 24-27, 2019. This will be the club's sixth year attending.

A search for a permanent replacement will be conducted in the spring. In addition, Kiara Anderson was hired as a Special Education Paraprofessional at the Batchelder School. We are now fully staffed with 41 new hires this year.
