I. Call to Order Open Session:

1. C.1. MSBA/SSBC Update:

- The last SSBC Meeting was held on February 11, 2014 beginning at 5:30 p.m.
- Construction Update: Mr. Venezia, Mr. Bowers and Mrs. Imbriano gave a brief update.
- Design Update: The High School ceiling tiles are being installed and much effort is focused on the coordination of utility installation in the auditorium.
- Invoices were approved. A report on the reimbursement from MSBA through December will be made at the next SSBC meeting.
- At 6:10 p.m. the SSBC entered into Executive Session to discuss the deployment of security devices and strategies with respect thereto and reconvened in Open Session.
- The next regular meeting of the SSBC is scheduled for Tuesday, February 25, 2014.

II. D.1. Northeast Metropolitan Regional Vocational High School: North Reading School Committee Representative Update:

Mrs. Judy Dyment, North Reading Representative to the Northeast Metropolitan Regional Vocational High School, and Superintendent/Director Ted Nickole attended the meeting and engaged in a discussion with the North Reading School Committee as requested through the 2013-2014 Goal for Family and Community Relations. They provided highlights from the school year to give the North Reading School Committee a better understanding of the work being done in that district. Mr. Nickole invited the Superintendent and School Committee to come to the Northeast Metro Tech for lunch and a tour, and to possibly have a joint meeting with the School Committees from all the districts that participate.

II. D.2. 2014-2015 Half Day Kindergarten Program:

Kindergarten registration for the 2014-2015 school year was recently held in all three schools. The elementary principals and Superintendent Willis met to review the distribution of full-day and half-day requests for next year. A comparison of the kindergarten program from this year to next year is as follows:

During their discussion they thought about ways to be most cost effective. One solution was to consider relocating one half-day session of kindergarten from the Hood School to the Batchelder School. Since the Batchelder School is already set up for two half-day sessions and will be down one half-day session next year, it is more cost effective to move the entire half-day session from the Hood to the Batch. The Hood School would need to locate another classroom and purchase additional supplies, materials, and furniture for a third kindergarten setting since we are adding another full-day session next year based on parent requests. If the enrollment at the Little School for next year stays as is, we will reduce the

full-day program by one but we need to watch the enrollment of the half-day program and will likely need to add a second session or redistrict new enrollments to the Batchelder.

After reviewing with the School Committee it was agreed that Superintendent Willis would continue to work with the principals to refine this plan.

In March 2013, a letter from several school districts was written to the NEASC expressing their concerns about the process.
