#### THE COMMUNITY

The Town of North Reading is a residential suburb located sixteen miles north of Boston. The town lies entirely within the watershed of the Ipswich River and is situated between two major highways, Route 93 and Route 95. There are approximately 15,000 residents in the town. The residents of North Reading have long demonstrated a commitment to providing students with a high quality education.

## NORTH READING HIGH SCHOOL

North Reading High School is a four-year, comprehensive public high school serving approximately 650 students in grades 9 through 12. North Reading High School is fully accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges.

In 2021, 57 students were recognized by the College Board as A.P. Scholars, A.P. Scholars with Honor, A.P. Scholars with Distinction or National A.P. Scholars for demonstrating college-level achievement through **Advanced Placement** courses and exams. At a minimum, a student must earn a score of "three" or better on three A.P. exams to be recognized as an A.P. Scholar.

## THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR

In mid-March of the 2019-20 school year, near the conclusion of term 3, North Reading High School shifted to remote learning in response to the global health crisis caused by the Coronavirus. Students received a standards-based grade during remote learning (i.e. Term 4). Students received final grades based on the follow-ing formula: Term 1-35%; Term 2-35%; MidEx-10%; Term 3-20%. To receive credit for a course, students had to earn a final grade of 60% or greater (based on the above-mentioned formula) and a minimum standards-based grade of "Developing Toward the Standard" during remote learning. Final grades were included in students' weighted and unweighted GPA's.

## THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR

The school operated in a hybrid model until April of 2021, when it returned to full-time, in-person learning. During hybrid learning, students participated in in-person learning five out of every ten school days. On days when students were not attending in-person, they participated in classes remotely through the use of Google Meet. Each of the four term grades comprised 25% of students' final grades.

## THE 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

School reopened with full-time, in-person learning for all students.

### CURRICULUM, SCHEDULING, AND COURSE LEVELS

The North Reading High School educational program affords students the opportunity to select courses in an array of subject areas. All students are required to enroll in eight, one credit courses. All courses are full-year courses. The school operates on a block schedule. Students attend four courses per day for a period of seventy-eight minutes each. Courses meet on an every other day basis.

#### Class Rank and Weighted Grade Point Average (WGPA)


Courses are weighted when computing the class rank and the WGPA. All courses except Band and Stage Band are used in computing the class rank and WGPA. The only course weighted as Standard is Academic Support. Class Rank is determined using the WGPA for each member of the graduating class and is reported using the following groupings: top 2%, 5%, 10%, 15%, 20%, 25%, 30%, 40%, 50%, 3rd quartile, and 4th quartile. The weighted GPA is calculated based on the following values:
